High-risk students see the love of Jesus through you. Thank you for loving them so well and in so many ways.

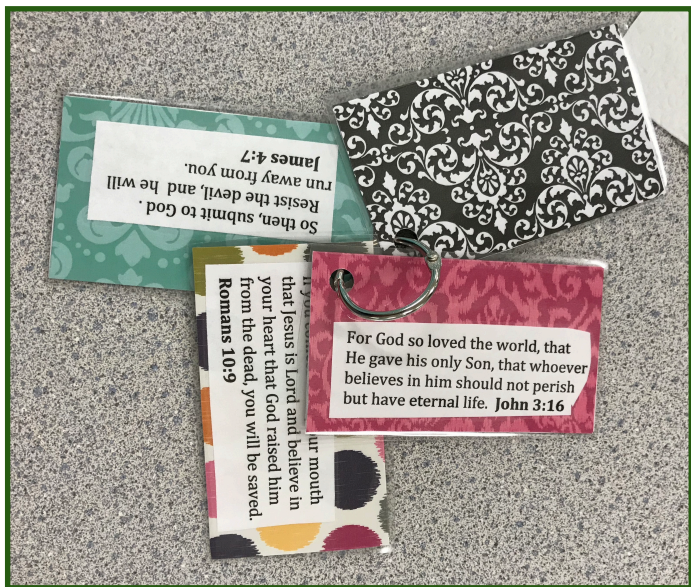


Your generosity provides New Testaments in modern language for each of our students at Fellowship of Christian Students so that they can read and study Scripture for themselves, many for the first time in their lives.

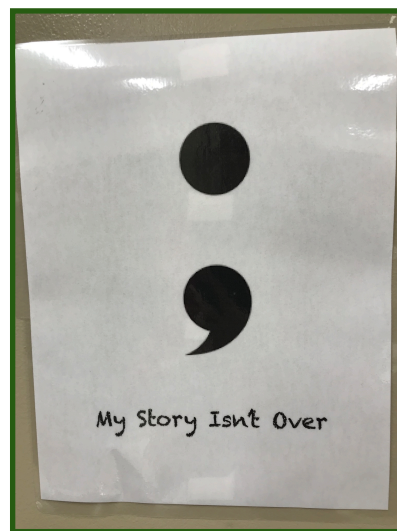


Your gifts provide food for hunger-at-risk students every week during the school term.

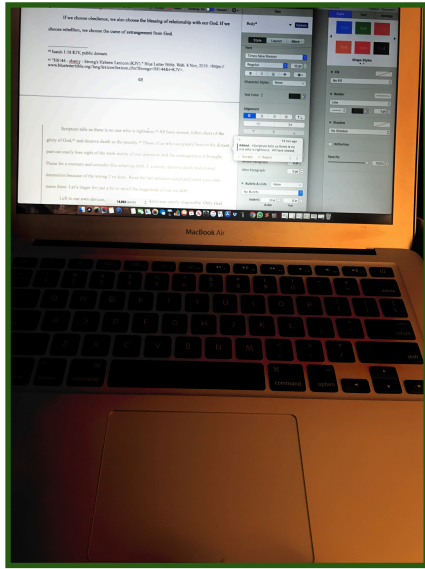

7. Planning for the Whisper Recharge meeting in February and ample participant sign-ups.
8. Writing a prayer guide based on Ephesians for the Matrix/DNow weekends in January and February.
9. Coordinating 24-hour prayer coverage throughout the Matrix weekend in February. (If you're willing to take a shift, please let me know.)
