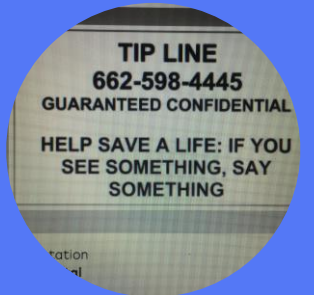
Medical equipment headed to Honduras

The body of Christ came together to provide nearly-new medical office equipment for Loma de Luz, a mission hospital in Honduras. A Tupelo businessman's generous donation was just the beginning. A Global volunteer built custom-designed pallets to hold the exam tables (and taught me to use a crowbar, sledge hammer, and electric saw), another volunteer helped organize donated supplies, and deacons and volunteers from Hope Church transported the equipment to Global Outreach. Your generosity provided supplies to wrap, palletize, and prepare it all for transport. Soon, volunteers from Biloxi will drive to Tupelo to pick up and transport everything to the coast for shipment to Honduras. Soon, it will all be used to share the love of Christ as doctors and nurses treat patients in Jesus' name.

Allie Nokes and Chandler Gurley participated in a recent prayer walk in Meridian MS following the April tornado that decimated the poorest neighborhoods in the city. 8 Days of Hope Crisis Response teams were on the scene. We had the honor of praying at and for their host church, with the teams, and throughout the neighborhoods, as well as with residents in the damaged areas.

SEE IT AND SAY IT

Recent school shootings and threats prompted a discussion with students and revealed a surprising truth...

Students didn't know how to report danger when they saw it, as evidenced by a fellow student who carried a weapon to school for several days before someone notified a teacher. Together, we provided 5,000 tip line cards to students at Tupelo High School, Middle School, and Fillmore Center, as well as to younger students. The cards provide the number to a text-only number. Scramble-technology provides 100% anonymity to reporting students. Now, if they see something, students know how to say something without fear of retribution.

What do medical equipment and tip line cards have to do with prayer ministry?

Prayer should be the starting point for all ministry, but it's not often the endpoint. Prayer connects us to the Father's heart and His will, prompts us to action, and undergirds every good work. Christian action should be birthed in prayer.

Topics for prayer:

1. Healing of cornea problems
2. Clear direction in ministry and writing
3. More opportunities to speak and teach this summer
4. Faithfulness to God's will and plan
