One of my favorite celebrations during the Easter Season is helping with our Maundy Thursday seder meal at Global Outreach Home Office.




Packing Party: I'm so grateful for the hard-working volunteers who did the good work of packing bags of food for our students with enthusiasm and great joy. These volunteers rock!
