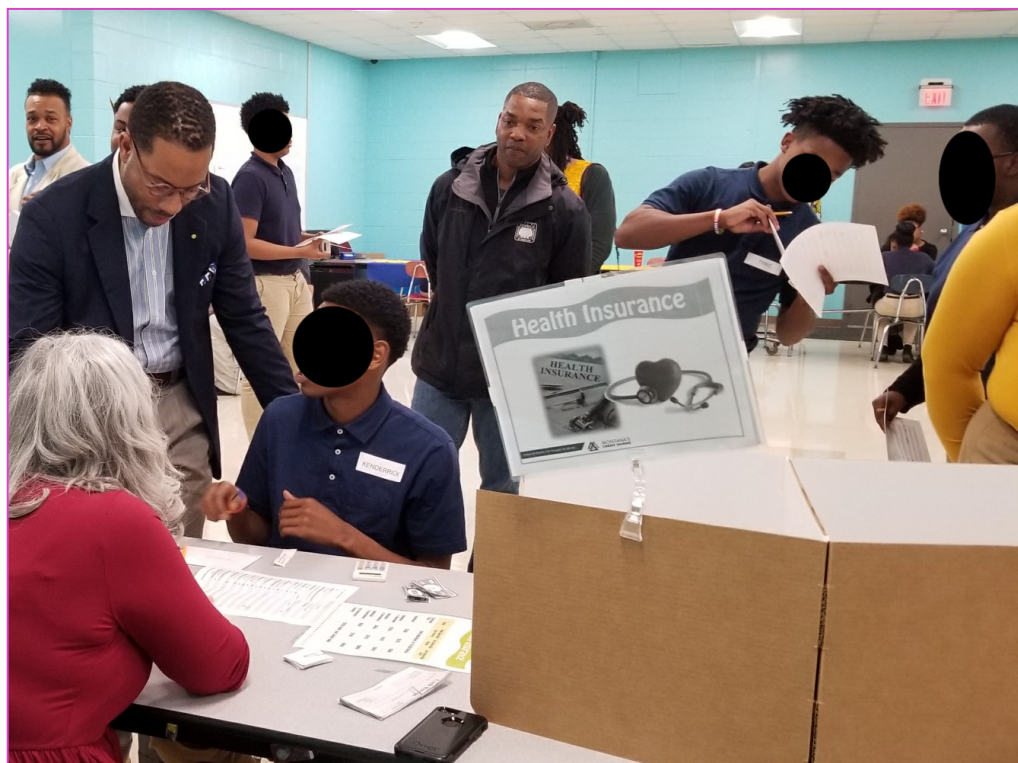

The day truth set students free...

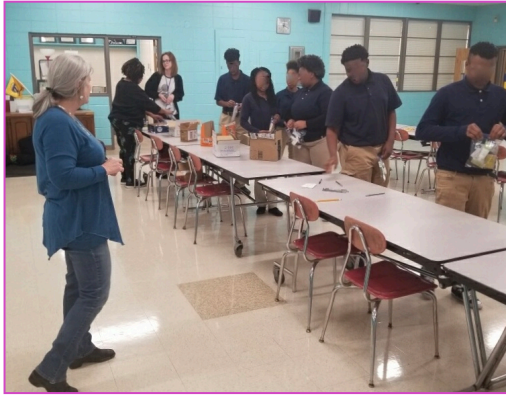
Our students hear the truth of Christ often. They have Bibles. They memorize Scripture. At our recent Career Reality Fair, truth became real and personal. The high school students were assigned careers based on interests and aptitudes and given projected salaries and family size. They went from station to station “spending” their salary on the essentials. Housing. Utilities. Food. Car. Fuel. Transportation. Health insurance. Student loans. They learned it’s not as easy as they thought to live independently and it takes a lot more money than they realized. **They left the fair with a new dedication to get serious about life, school, goals, and hard work. When the truth we’d taught combined with the reality of life, getting serious about their faith became a higher priority.** I’ve received lots of hugs and thanks from our students in the last few weeks.
