Ask yourself:

Do I miss blessings from God  
because of my disobedience

in any areas of my life?

What changes are needed to

live as God intended?



“You will seek Me  
and find Me when  
you search for Me  
with all your heart.”

Jeremiah 29:13



The Hebrew word translated as  
“search” means to beat or  
trample a path, to go to a place  
frequently.

We are to wholeheartedly  
trample a path to God.



Pause here to  
“trample a path to God.”  
Worship the Holy One who  
willingly allows us to find Him,  
commune with Him,  
and serve Him.



“...there was great mourning among the Jews, with fasting, weeping, and wailing; and many lay on sackcloth and ashes.”

Esther 4:3



The Jews were not in Persia because they wanted to be but because they were exiles from Israel who had not yet returned to their homeland.

Only when their lives were threatened with a violent end did they come to the end of themselves and repent.





Ask yourself:

What would it take to break my heart over my sin, both overt and hidden?

Why wait?

Repent and surrender now.



“So these days were to be remembered and celebrated throughout every generation...”  
The memories were not to fade from their descendants...

Esther 9:28



Ask yourself:

In what ways has God moved on my behalf?

How has He rescued me?

What memories of God's faithfulness do I want my children and grandchildren to remember?



# Give thanks:

Take time now to remember and celebrate all He's done for you with thanksgiving.

Be sure to pass along your stories of grace and mercy.



“Do not imagine that you...can  
escape...For if you remain silent  
at this time, relief and  
deliverance will arise...from  
another place...”

Esther 4:13,14



Speaking up can be costly but so  
can silence.

Ask yourself:

For what am I willing to die?

For what am I willing to stay up even  
when it's dangerous?



Pray for our pastors, elders, and  
deacons to lead the way in speaking  
up on behalf of the vulnerable, the  
lost, and the wandering.

Pray we as the body of Christ will  
follow their bold example.



“When Mordecai learned all that had been done, he tore his clothes, put on sackcloth and ashes, and went out into the midst of the city and wailed loudly and bitterly.” Esther 4:1





Ask yourself:

Do I care about those in danger  
of perishing (the lost, the  
prodigal) enough to mourn,  
weep, fast, and pray with all my  
heart?



Take action:

Consider those you know who are without Christ. Are you content to allow them an eternity in hell?

If not, pray with the heart of Mordecai that they will surrender to the Lordship of Jesus.
